BOW VALLEY PARKWAY WELCOMES VISITORS



Enjoy the new entrances welcoming visitors to travel and experience the Bow Valley Parkway, the scenic route connecting Lake Louise and Banff and a continuation of the Legacy Trail. This slow paced two lane 48 km. road is a naturally and historically significant area of Banff National Park and a year-round amazing scenic heritage experience. It is an exceptional place for its sightseeing, many view points, award winning exhibits, history, and wildlife viewing.

The Bow Valley Parkway provides one of the best wildlife viewing opportunities in Banff National Park. The first grizzly, #122, has been spotted over the last few weeks. Enjoy responsible wildlife viewing of wolves, big horn sheep, black bears, grizzlies, moose, and elk by remaining in your car. Marvel at the scenery, stop at the pullouts, and learn about the natural and geographical history through the interactive displays.

Take a hike up Johnston Canyon, picnic, photograph Castle Mountain, dine at Baker Creek, cycle, camp, or stay overnight at one of the three cabin resorts. The Bow Valley Parkway is definitely a road worth traveling anytime of the year. When you enter under the arch, you will feel a sense of arrival for this unique and distinctive road.
